Threefold Cord Meeting

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"I am the Lord. I have called you in righteousness; I have taken you by the hand and kept you." Isaiah 42:6

At our recent meetings, I invited our Session and the Sessions of Carter- Westminster and Niles to hear again the words of the prophet Isaiah, chapter 42:1-9. The prophet was speaking for God to the people in exile calling them to remember their relationship with their God, to be



encouraged in this time of uncertainty, discomfort, and change. The prophet is reminding the people they are a servant people, calling them to trust the God who created them, who calls them into a covenantal relationship with God and each other, who has done great things for them in the past, and now calls them into a new future. Of course, the verse/image that our Session latched onto is of a God who holds our hand and will keep us in all times.

The Sessions of the Threefold Cord churches met last Sunday to share where each church is in their thinking and feeling about possible merger and to discuss a proposal for moving forward. The Sessions of all three churches **approved** the following proposal:

- To create a task force/team, made up of three persons from each church (two elders and one member-at-large), each Session to determine their representatives by May 3, 2020.
- To enlist a consultant (with the churches sharing the cost equally) to provide unbiased leadership to the task force/team through the exploration and planning process. The Rev. Elizabeth Wagner, a member of the Presbytery Committee on Ministry, a skilled transitional pastor and trainer, having experience with mergers was identified as available and willing.
- For the team/task force to report back in one month as to its process and progress.

It was made clear that the team/task force would be open to all possibilities of shared mission, shared leadership, shared space. The team/task force would be committed to transparency with the congregations and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The goal is not survival but faithfulness to God's vision and purpose and our commitment is to be the body of Jesus Christ in this time and place. We are asking for your prayers for our team/task force in this time of exploration and planning.

It is Christ who invites us and Christ who connects us.

Be encouraged, God is holding our hand and will keep us.




Treasurer's Comments:

First quarter income was higher than expected after receiving a generous gift from a member. Rent was received from CBB even though they suspended operations part way through the month.

Second quarter will be more challenging. CBB's April rent was waived and future waivers will be examined monthly. Until the Stay-at-Home order is removed, we are unlikely to receive any Facility Use Income. Your continued support of the church through tithes and offerings is encouraging and received gratefully. With a judicious use of our invested funds, we will see our way through these challenging times.
